The Honorable Colette D. Honorable is a highly regarded policymaker and strategist in domestic and international energy sectors. For over fifteen years, she has been a global leader in energy, focusing on clean energy integration, energy storage integration, infrastructure development and energy efficiency. Honorable is a member of Reed Smith LLP's Energy and Natural Resources Group where she leads the energy regulatory group. In this capacity, she is a trusted legal and strategic advisor to her clients, many of which are Fortune 500 entities. Honorable also sits on the firm's Executive Committee, global governing board, and serves on its Audit and Talent Committees. Prior to joining Reed Smith, Honorable served as a Commissioner at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). She was nominated by then President Barack Obama and unanimously confirmed by the U.S. Senate in December 2014 for a term that expired in June 2017.

Honorable also serves as an Independent Director for Southern Company (NYSE:SO), a Fortune 200 energy company that serves 9 million customers in the Southeast United States, based in Atlanta, Georgia.

A proud native of Little Rock, Arkansas, she is a graduate of the University of Memphis, received a Juris Doctor from the University of Arkansas at Little Rock School of Law and is a member of St. Mark Baptist Church. She and her late husband, Rickey Honorable, share a daughter, Sydney Marie, who is a junior at Howard University.

WHEREAS, one of Oscar's greatest gifts was being a disciple of Christ and freely serving others and the community; he served as a Deacon at Saint Mark Baptist Church; Oscar was a faithful volunteer, mentor, and leader of various organizations such as Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.; Big Brothers Big Sisters of Pulaski County; Pulaski Technical College; Alumni Association for the University of Central Arkansas; the Arkansas Home Builder's Association; American Heart Association, and

WHEREAS, after Oscar Washington, Jr. transitioned in April 2017, his family and friends created the Oscar Washington, Jr. Educational Fund to honor his memory and continue his legacy; and

WHEREAS, since the first Oscar Washington, Jr., Scholarship Banquet, in five years, the Fund has amassed a diverse alumni group of scholars that number 50 bright, young Arkansans with the inaugural scholarship recipients set to graduate from college next year; and

WHEREAS, more than \$20,000 has been given to community-based organizations to increase their ability to impact youth and adults in need; and

WHEREAS, in 2020 the Alma J. Washington Educator of the Year Award was established in 2020 and has recognized educators for their significant and necessary contributions to the lives of students; and

WHEREAS, the OWJ Internship Initiative has been established which engages local companies to provide paid internships for OWJ scholars in their chosen field of study; and

WHEREAS, the Oscar Washington, Jr., Educational Fund was selected as one of four educational entities to distribute \$25,000 a year to a student or students who met the qualifications with the funds intended to supplement that student's tuition, room and board so they graduate from an Arkansas college or university with zero debt; and

WHEREAS, on April 30, 2022, family and friends of Oscar D. Washington, Jr., are gathering for the fifth annual Scholarship Banquet to celebrate Oscar's memory and his legacy, as well as to hear wisdom from keynote speaker the Honorable Colette Honorable.



Biden names UA graduate as Arkansas' Farm Service Agency executive director

President Joe Biden has named Doris Washington as the Farm Service Agency state executive director for Arkansas, where she will oversee the implementation of agricultural policy in the Natural State.

Washington, a U.S. Army National Guard veteran and a two-time graduate of the University of Arkansas, has worked as the director of the National Water Management Center at the Natural Resources Conservation Service, where she oversaw a \$2.2 million budget and directed operations, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

The center also implemented an analysis of watershed environmental projects under her guidance, the USDA said.

Washington, 55, is one of many USDA appointees announced by Biden this month. Other appointees include Farm Service Agency state executive directors for Illinois, Maine, Texas, Kentucky, Missouri and Nebraska.

The White House described Washington, a Harrisburg native, as an expert in "crops and natural resources science" and said she has served as the acting deputy chief for management and strategy for the Natural Resources Conservation Service.

She also served as acting state conservationist and national team leader for administrative transformation for the conservation service, according to the White House.

Washington has more than a decade of service with the Arkansas Army National Guard as an officer, the Biden administration said.

The Farm Service Agency administers credit and loan programs, carries out agricultural policy and manages conservation and farm marketing programs nationwide.

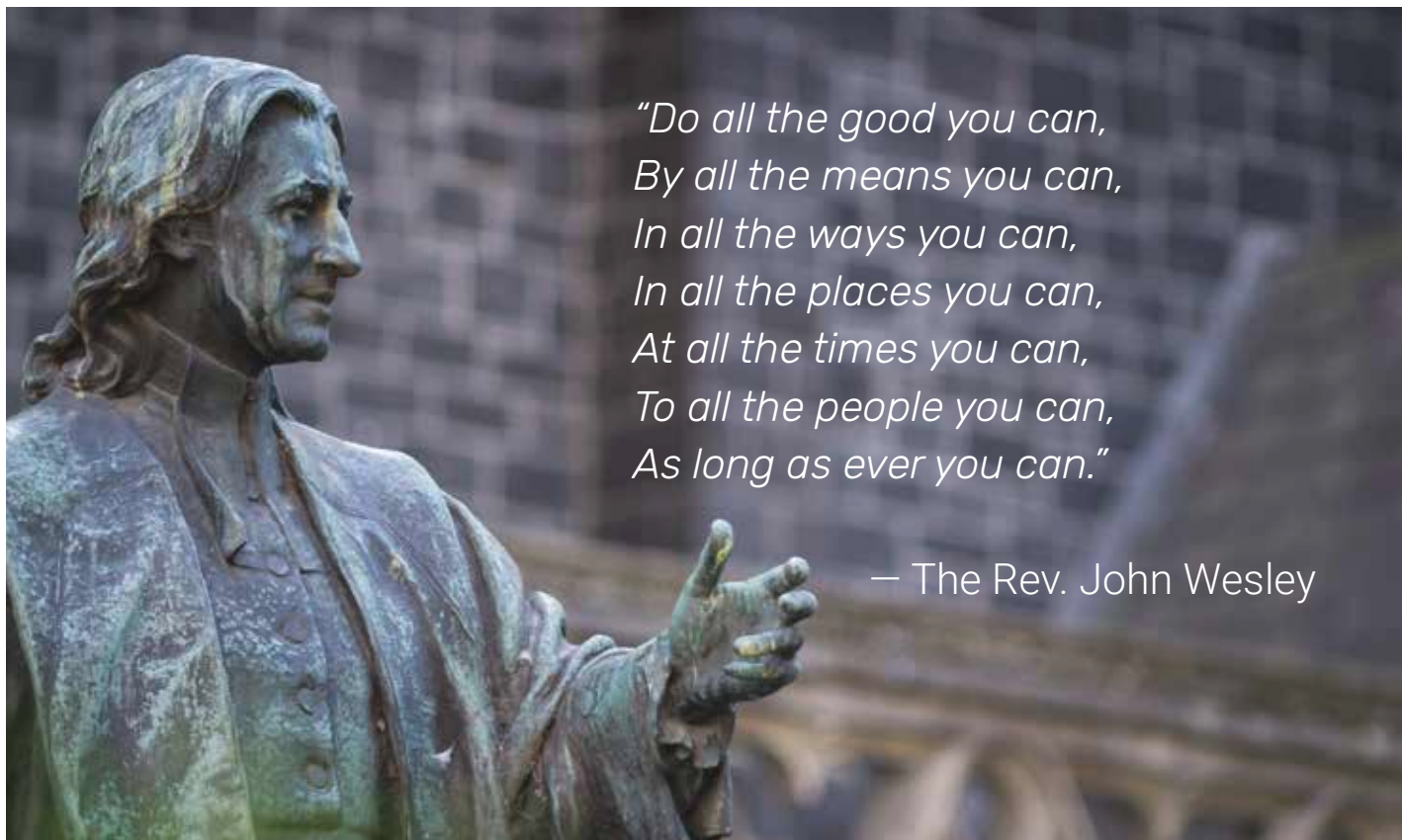
In a news release earlier this month on Washington's appointment and others, Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack said the appointees will play an important role in the mission of improving the lives of Americans.

"Each of them will add to the experienced, dedicated and growing team at the department," he said in the release.

Washington holds a bachelor's degree in agriculture and has received a master of public administration in public policy, according to the USDA.

Washington has a long history with the federal department.

At the conclusion of her first year in college, Washington's high school principal reached out to inquire if she would be interested in a student internship at a local USDA office, Washington told the Democrat-Gazette previously. Washington accepted the opportunity, she said.
